Right to Live, founded in 2012, is India's first crowd donation platform, exclusively dedicated to funding medical treatment for the underprivileged. So far we have funded life-saving medical treatment of 60 patients of all ages, residing mostly in the state of Karnataka. Treatment received includes chemotherapy, open-heart surgery, dialysis for kidney failure, and more. Every case is personally researched and followed through home visits, medical records check, and hospital visits. Right to Live is unique in that it gives 100% of all donations received directly to the patients' treatment as all administration costs are covered by trustees.

Help Ramamurthy get posterior Urethral surgery.

Ramamurthy is 16 years old and was the unfortunate victim of an accident eight years back. To date, he has had 5 surgeries and had to drop out of school. Recently he was experiencing pain in his urethra, and now needs anastomotic arthroplasty surgery. Ramamurthy needs Rs.80,000 for this surgery, but his family cannot bear the cost. Why don't you consider helping this teenager feel better and get back to school?



Help Manjunath get Open heart surgery.

Manjunath is 15 years old and studying in 10th standard at Kanyakumari School. He was recently diagnosed with a hole in his heart, for which Jayadeva Hospital has recommended open heart surgery at the cost of Rs.80,000. Helped Tarannum get hip surgery

Tarannum is 30 years old and has undergone a kidney transplant. Due to the side effects of the continued medications, she has developed a problem in her hip which requires surgery. She comes from a low socio-economic background and needed help to pay for the hip surgery which costs Rs.60,000. We have managed to raise the required amount for her surgery, thanks to our generous donors, and Tarannum will soon be scheduled for surgery.



Helped Vani get hearing aids

Vani is 9 years old, the eldest daughter of Kala and Satish. Her father earns a very low daily wage, while her mother works in a special school as an attender barely earning Rs.3500 per month. When Vani was 1½ years old, her parents realized that she was unable to hear, after which doctors at Chandra Shekhar Speech and Hearing School found that there was profound hearing loss. Thanks to our generous donors, we have raised Rs.25,000 for the basic hearing aids for Vani.
