EDUCATION

1. School Digitization - Advancing Digital Education in Rural India

In today's technology-driven world, digital education is essential. Yet, many government schools in India remain under-equipped, limiting students' exposure to modern learning methods. Right To Live's School Digitization initiative addresses this gap by empowering rural students with the tools and skills needed to thrive in a digital future.

(The achievements mentioned under each section are for the FY 2025-26)

a) Smart Classrooms in Government Schools

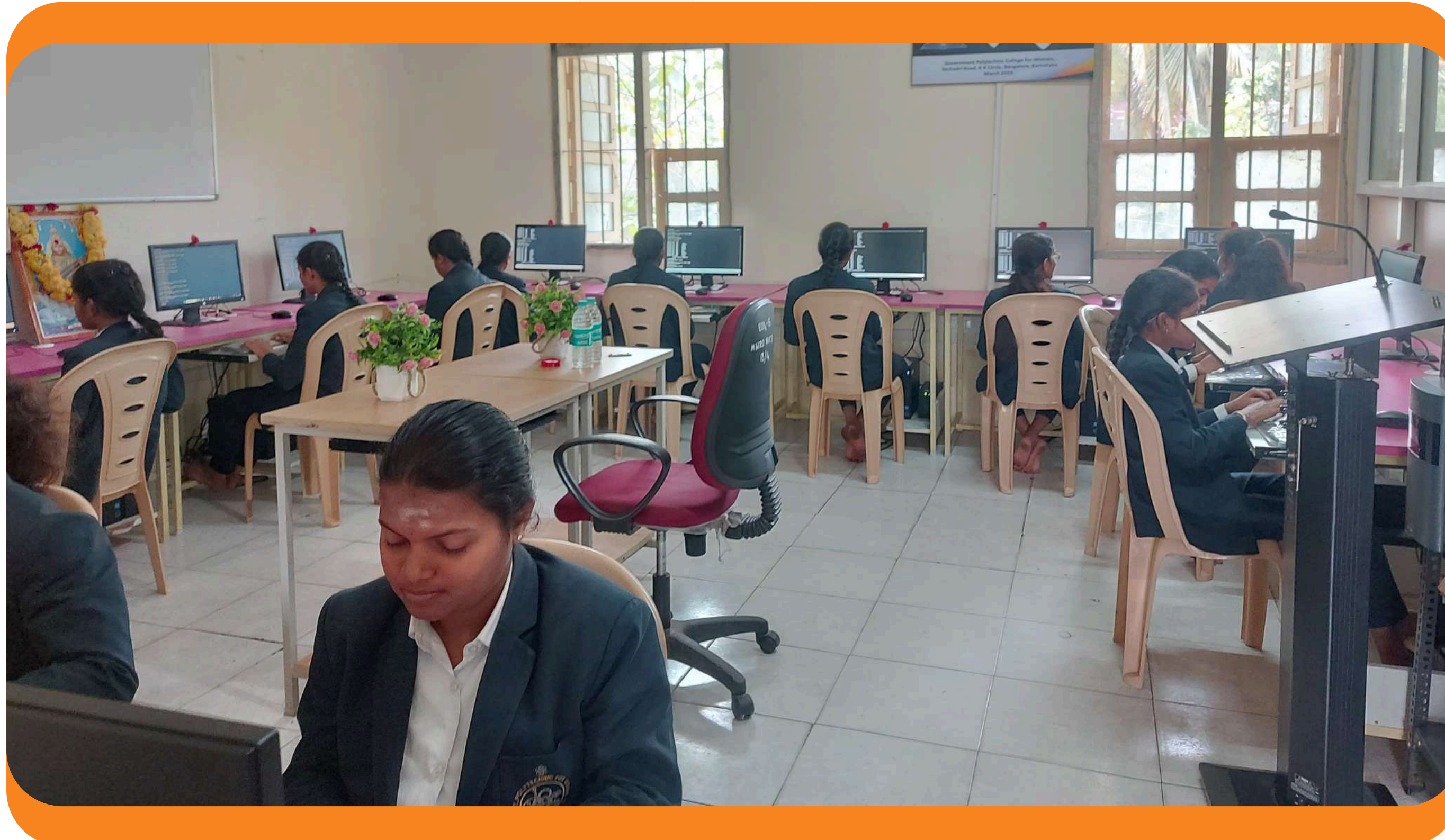
Right To Live is committed to enhancing learning experiences through digital education. By integrating smart TVs and interactive panels into classrooms, we provide access to visually engaging content that boosts comprehension and retention.



31 smart classrooms set up across government schools and colleges in Karnataka.

b) Computer Labs in Government Educational Institutions

Many government school students are first-generation users of digital devices and are often hesitant to engage with technology. Our computer labs create hands-on opportunities for students to build digital skills with confidence.



9 new computer labs established in government schools, PUCs and Polytechnic colleges, helping bridge the digital divide.

c) Digital Devices for Rural Schools

A lack of basic digital infrastructure prevents many schools from adopting modern teaching tools. By supplying projectors, desktops, laptops, and power backup systems, we enable tech-integrated learning environments in underserved regions.



7 rural government schools in Hassan, Chamarajanagar, Bangalore and Bangalore Rural districts digitally upgraded.

2. School Improvement – Building Stronger Foundations for Learning

Poverty and economic challenges continue to be major barriers to school participation in rural India. While access to education has increased, sustained engagement requires focused interventions to create a conducive and inclusive learning environment. Right To Live addresses these critical gaps through infrastructure upgrades and essential school facilities.

a) Toilet Construction in Government Schools

Access to clean, hygienic sanitation is fundamental to student well-being—particularly for girls in rural areas. Many government schools still lack functional toilets or have poorly maintained facilities, leading to health risks and school dropouts.



Constructed toilets at 3 government schools, ensuring students—especially girls—can attend school with dignity and safety.

b) School Renovations

Essential infrastructure upgrades such as repairing leaking roofs, replacing broken windows and doors, painting classrooms, and improving sanitation have significantly enhanced the physical learning environment.

- Renovated 6 government schools, including GHS and GGHS Gudibande, Chikkaballapura, GHS Yelahanka, Bangalore, GMPS Doddakallasandra, Bangalore, ZPHS Kamapalli, Khammam and GHPS, Chilakadrihalli, Shivamogga
- 2 of these schools underwent comprehensive transformation – Smart Classroom, Classroom Renovation, Roof and ceiling fixing, electric connections, painting, Drinking Water RO Filters, Toilet Renovation and more.

c) Classroom Furniture Support

In many rural schools, children are still forced to sit on the floor, affecting posture, focus, and learning outcomes. Providing appropriate seating arrangements helps improve student comfort and classroom discipline.

- Supplied 659 desk-benches, 30+ Almirahs, 10+ Green Boards, Nali Kali Play Materials, and 100+ chairs to 25+ government schools across Karnataka.



d) Science Lab Equipment/STEM Lab/Automobile Lab

Science education thrives on hands-on learning. However, a lack of lab resources in government high schools, PUCs, and polytechnic colleges prevents students from experiencing practical science.

- Equipped 22 government colleges in Bengaluru, Ramanagara, Bagepalli, Mandya, Tumkur, Dakshina Kannada, Gulbarga and Bidar with science lab kits to enhance experiential learning.



e) School Bags Distribution

Children from underprivileged backgrounds often lack basic school essentials. Providing durable school bags not only supports their academic routine but also serves as an incentive to continue their education.

- Distributed school bags to 3,067 students across various government schools in Karnataka.



f) Bicycle Distribution

Students from remote villages often travel long distances to reach school, leading to fatigue, irregular attendance, and higher dropout rates—especially among girls. Providing bicycles helps ease their daily commute and encourages continued education.

- Distributed bicycles to 367 students of 8th and 9th grade across 10 schools in remote villages of Bagepalli and Humnabad, based on school-verified need, prioritising girls and those travelling more than 3 km one way.



g) Access to Clean Drinking Water

Unsafe drinking water continues to pose health risks to school children, especially in rural areas. Right To Live addresses this by installing clean water systems to prevent waterborne diseases and ensure students' well-being.

- Installed RO water purifiers in 4 government schools in Bagepalli, Sullia and Khammam.



h) School Van Donation – Sandeep Special School (M B Foundation), Sullia

- A school van was donated to Sandeep Special School (M B Foundation), Sullia, which provides special education and care for 40+ children with special needs from nearby villages. The initiative aimed to ensure safe and reliable transportation for students, reduce commuting challenges for families, and support uninterrupted access to education, therapy, and rehabilitation services.



3. Higher Education and Skill Upgradation – Empowering Futures

Right To Live is committed to nurturing talent and building confidence among underprivileged youth—especially women in rural and remote areas—by providing access to higher education and essential 21st-century skills. These interventions are designed to reduce the education-to-employment gap and help students become self-reliant, confident, and future-ready.

a) Vocational Training – Sphurti Skill Development Centres

As India's economy evolves, the demand for skilled, job-ready professionals continues to grow. To address unemployment, particularly among rural youth and women, Right To Live operates Sphurti Skill Development Centres in Humnabad (Bidar) and Sullia (Dakshina Kannada), providing industry-aligned vocational training. In FY 2025–26,

- 260 students from low-income families received training in Basic Computer Applications, DTP (Desktop Publishing), and Tally.
- 80 women were trained in tailoring, opening doors to self-employment and micro-entrepreneurship



b) A Sewing Machine donation for Women

To further support women trained in tailoring and enable them to transition into sustainable livelihoods, access to basic equipment is essential. Many women from low-income backgrounds face financial constraints in setting up their own work.

- Distributed 39 sewing machines to deserving women in Humnabad, Bidar, empowering them to start home-based tailoring units, generate income, and move towards financial independence and self-employment.



c) Education Scholarship Program

The Education Scholarship Program supports academically bright students from underprivileged backgrounds with financial aid to continue their higher studies.

- Scholarships are awarded to students scoring 70% and above, following a thorough need-based assessment.
- Once selected, support continues until the student completes their graduation, subject to performance.
- In FY 2025–26, scholarships worth INR 30 lakhs were disbursed to 220 deserving students across Karnataka.



d) SSLC Science & Mathematics Academic Support Program

In collaboration with Sankalp Learning, a large-scale academic intervention was implemented to strengthen Science and Mathematics learning outcomes among Class 10 students in KREIS residential schools across Karnataka.

- 20,000+ students supported across multiple districts in Karnataka.
- 150+ hours of structured, board-aligned academic sessions delivered.
- 100% coverage of key SSLC Science and Mathematics concepts through a focused curriculum.
- Regular assessments, revisions, and exam-oriented practice are conducted to track progress.

The program significantly contributed to improving conceptual understanding, exam readiness, and student confidence. By addressing learning gaps at scale, the initiative enabled students from underserved communities to perform better in SSLC examinations and take a step forward toward higher education and STEM career opportunities.



e) Spoken English Program – Digital & Teacher-Led Approach

In rural schools, limited access to English-speaking environments affects students' confidence and communication skills.

- In partnership with Sharadha Trust's Sulaab App, teachers from KPS, Chakavelu, Sri Vinayaka High School, Naremaddepalli and Government Model Higher Primary School, Somenahalli, Bagepalli were trained in English communication techniques.
- Smart TVs and tablets were provided to integrate digital content into classrooms.
- The program benefitted 100+ students, who showed marked improvement in spoken English and classroom participation.



f) Soft Skills and Presentation Training

In collaboration with corporate volunteers, soft skills training sessions were conducted to prepare students for professional environments.

- **More than 60 students each from:**

Government Polytechnic College for Women, KR Circle, Bengaluru, were mentored in communication, interpersonal behaviour, teamwork, and workplace readiness.



HEALTHCARE

Well-being and Healthcare – Building Healthier Communities

Right To Live works to ensure better health and well-being for individuals and communities through accessible, preventive, and responsive healthcare initiatives. By addressing systemic gaps—especially in underserved regions—we promote a healthier, more resilient society.

a) Clean Drinking Water – Community RO Plants in Bagepalli

Bagepalli Taluk (Chikkaballapur District, Karnataka), once a fertile agricultural region, now faces a severe water crisis. With over 80% of groundwater contaminated by fluoride and harmful salts, the health and safety of thousands are at risk.

- Right To Live set up 4 Reverse Osmosis (RO) Plants powered by solar energy, promoting sustainability and reducing the carbon footprint across Bagepalli in FY 2025–26.
- Over 5,000 villagers now have daily access to clean, safe drinking water—ending their reliance on contaminated sources or long treks to distant RO units.



b) Community Toilet Construction at Sri Lakshmi Venkateshwara Swamy Temple, Bagepalli (Gadidam)

- With the support of individual donors, a new community toilet facility was constructed at the renowned Sri Lakshmi Venkateshwara Swamy Temple, Gadidam Village, Bagepalli Taluk, Chikkaballapur District, which previously lacked functional sanitation facilities for devotees and visitors. The initiative improved access to safe and hygienic sanitation, enhancing cleanliness, convenience, and public health conditions for the local community and the large number of pilgrims visiting the temple.



c) Medical Support for Critically Ill Patients

Right To Live provides financial assistance to underprivileged patients facing life-threatening health issues, referred by individuals, corporates, hospitals, and partner NGOs.

- In FY 2025–26, 30 patients received critical financial support, enabling access to timely medical care and life-saving interventions.

d) Support for Children with Type 1 Diabetes

Children from low-income families living with Type 1 diabetes require consistent access to insulin and glucose-monitoring tools, which many cannot afford.

- In partnership with Idhayangal Charitable Trust and with support from Life for a Child and VGS Foundation, Right To Live distributed glucometers to over 1,000 underprivileged children.
- This support empowers families to better manage their children's health and prevent complications.



COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Sustainability and Community Welfare Initiatives

To promote sustainability and strengthen community infrastructure, multiple initiatives focusing on renewable energy, environmental conservation, and public welfare were implemented across healthcare, education, and community spaces in underserved regions.

- **Solar-Powered Primary Health Centre (PHC), Julapalya, Bagepalli**

A solar power system was installed at the Government Primary Health Centre (PHC) in Julapalya, Bagepalli. The PHC serves 10–12 inpatients and manages an average of 100 outpatient (OPD) registrations daily. The installation ensures uninterrupted power supply, thereby enhancing the continuity and quality of healthcare services.



- **Solar-Powered Vocational Training Centre, Humnabad (Bidar District)**

Solar panels were installed at Right To Live's Vocational Training Centre in Humnabad, Bidar district. The centre provides skill-based training annually to 240 unemployed youth in Basic Computer Skills, Tally, and DTP, along with 80 women in tailoring. The solar installation supports uninterrupted training operations and promotes a sustainable learning environment.



- **Solar Streetlights in Rural Communities, Bagepalli (Chikkaballapura District)**

Solar streetlights were installed across 5 remote villages and 2 schools in Bagepalli, Chikkaballapura district. These installations improve safety, enhance mobility in the evening, and contribute to better living and learning conditions in underserved communities.



- **Tree Plantation Drives in Government Schools and Humnabad City**

Tree plantation drives were conducted in 2 government schools in Sullia and across selected public spaces in Humnabad city to promote environmental sustainability and increase green cover. These initiatives contributed to creating cleaner and healthier surroundings for students and local communities while also encouraging environmental awareness and community participation in conservation efforts.



EVENTS AND VOLUNTEERING

Volunteering is more than just an act of service—it is a shared commitment to build a better society. Right To Live continues to actively engage corporate partners and their employees in year-round volunteering initiatives that make a tangible difference in the lives of underserved communities. These efforts also serve to raise awareness, foster empathy, and cultivate a culture of giving back.

a) TCS World 10K Marathon – 2025

- The TCS World 10K Marathon, held in April 2025 in Bangalore, is among India's premier marathon events.
- Right To Live participated for the Fourth consecutive year, raising awareness and funds for the Improvement of government schools in rural Karnataka.
- Over 225 runners, including corporate partners from AtkinsRéalis and Opteamix and several individual donors, ran to support the cause.
- The campaign raised over ₹35.29 lakhs, making Right To Live the second-highest fundraising NGO of the event.
- Our team also won Second place in the 'Run in Costume' Team Contest,

b) Employee Volunteering & School Engagement Initiatives

Right To Live coordinated a series of high-impact employee volunteering programs throughout the year, in collaboration with leading corporate partners, driving meaningful engagement in education and community development. 40+ volunteering events conducted in partnership with 10+ corporates, engaging 4,000+ employee volunteers across multiple locations

- **School Engagement Visits:** Volunteers conducted interactive in-person sessions, including storytelling, motivational talks, STEM model demonstrations, and life skills training, fostering holistic student development



- **Preparation of Educational Learning Models:** Corporate volunteers from Cisco, Microsoft, Wipfli, Hy-Vee, Opteamix, and others designed and developed science, mathematics, and geography models to promote hands-on, experiential learning in government schools



- **Corporate Exposure Visits for Students:** Students were taken on educational visits to corporate offices and museums, where volunteers conducted sessions on AI, interview skills, and career awareness, while also providing workplace exposure through guided office tours



- **Corporate Team Visits to Rural Schools:** Teams from Cisco, Nasdaq, AtkinsRéalis, and Blackhawk Network visited rural schools to understand grassroots challenges and engage directly with students and educators



- **School Beautification Drives:** Volunteers from Cisco, Opteamix, Wipfli, and others revitalised government school infrastructure through classroom and compound wall painting, creating more engaging learning environments



- **Tree Plantation Drives:** In collaboration with multiple corporates, plantation drives were organised across educational institutions to promote environmental awareness and enhance green cover



- **Plogging & Cleaning Drives:** Employee volunteers participated in plogging and cleaning drives at Gudibande Fort and government schools, combining waste collection activities with environmental awareness initiatives. These drives promoted cleanliness, responsible community participation, and environmental sustainability while creating healthier and more engaging spaces for students and local communities.



These initiatives strengthened the connection between corporates and communities, enriched student learning experiences, and fostered a culture of volunteerism and social responsibility.

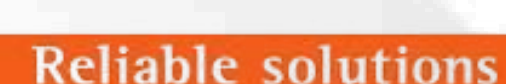
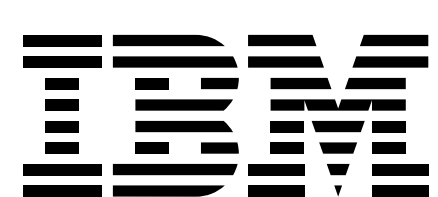

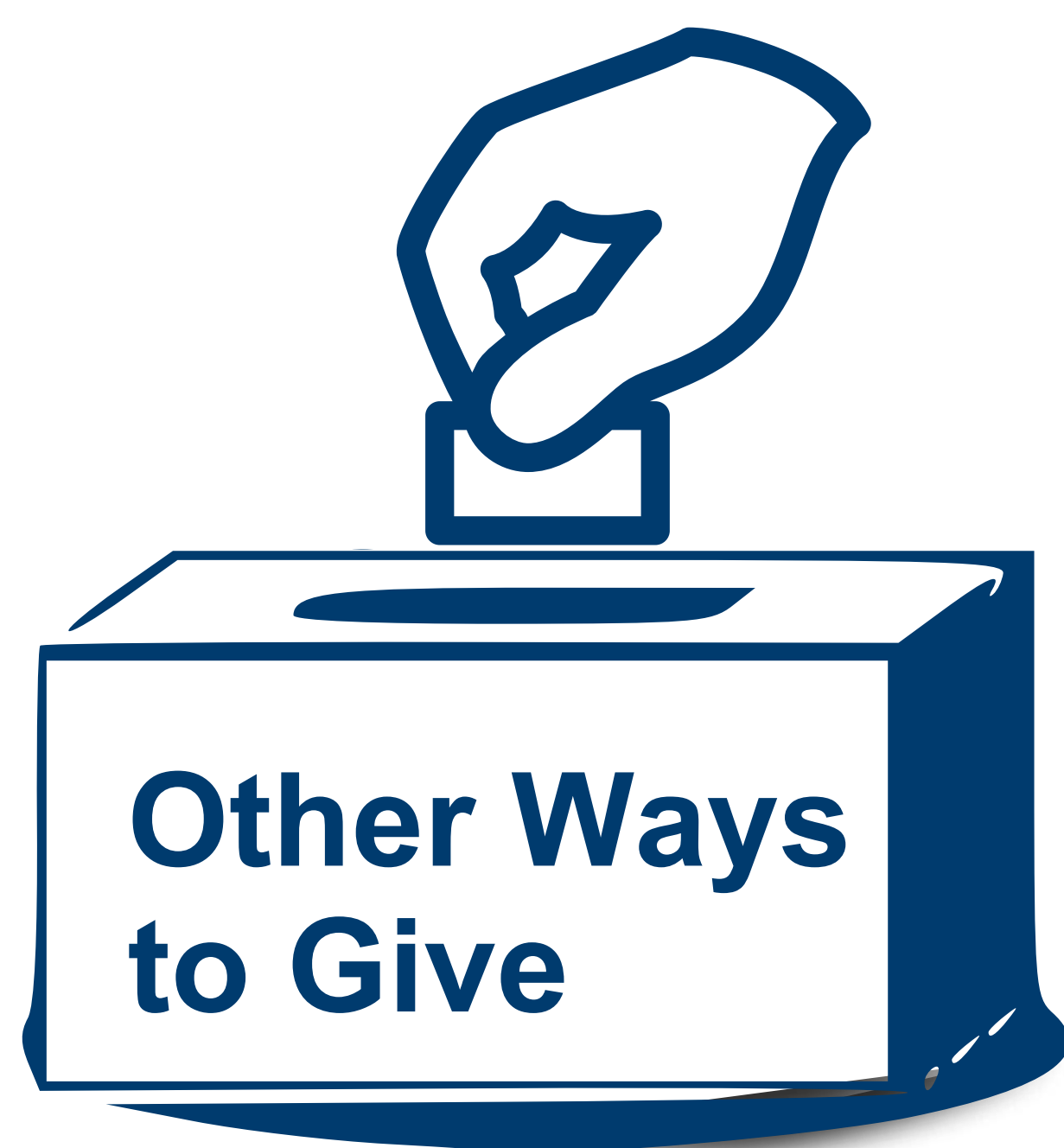
